

Summer School 2022 Description of Sectionals

Academic Skills Development: (Grades 1-8) Tutoring, skills development/recovery, credit recovery (grades 9-12) for students with a licensed teacher. Students can be referred for this program by parents or teachers.

Art Camp (Grades 1-6) During Art Camp students will be creating original works of art to offer for sale at the Annual Cornucopia Art Crawl in September 2021. Students are encouraged to attend the Art Crawl in September following the Art Camp. Members of CAC will also be at the camp to assist students with their work. Students will have ample time, space, and materials to create their art. Watercolor techniques, clay and various other projects will be taught. **(Capped at 20)**

Basketball Skills Development: (Grades 2-8) Develop your basketball skills and get ready to be an improved player. This session is offered for any student entering grades 2-8 who wish to develop their individual basketball skills. Focus points will include ball-handling, passing, shooting form, and game decisions. Students will work on independent skills and will also have the opportunity to practice their skills in “game-like situations”.

College Visits: (Grades 10-12) This session is offered to students entering 10th - 12th grade who would like to visit different colleges to see the campus and learn about programs offered at each. Schools to visit may include UMD, UWS, WITC Ashland, WITC Superior, Lake Superior College, Gogebic Community College, UW Eau Claire and UW Stout. A schedule will be put together and students can sign up to attend all 4 days, or select specific days of choice. This will be a four-day schedule (M-Th). **(Capped at 9)**

Drama Camp (Grades 4-12) This week-long class prepares students for stage acting and/or preparation. Practice a play all week, with the production of the play for the community taking place Friday. **(Capped at 25)**

Engine/Automotive Learning (Grades 8-12) Students will be introduced to basic engine operations, electrical systems, measurements, basic car parts identification, and auto computer basics. They will gain practical skills as they work on projects of their own and projects already underway at the shop. **(Capped at 9)**

Introduction to Aviation (Grades 8-12) Students will be introduced to basic aviation terms and concepts while they help work on an airplane that is being restored. Topics will include flight navigation and rules, airplane dynamics, and many others. They will take a trip to an airport to view other airplanes, with a possible airplane ride on the last day. **(Capped at 9)**

European Travel Club. Immerse in culture, appreciate theater and art, see history, and explore new foods on an eleven-day adventure in London and Paris. (For students currently enrolled in the June 2022 Europe Trip).

Open Swimming (Grades 1-8) Apply learned swimming skills in the Bayfield pool. This is for students who have already gone through swimming lessons (either this year, or prior years, through South Shore or some other organization). **(Capped at 30)**

Oulu Heritage Week 1: (Grades 1-12) Exploring our Local Cultures, History, and Environment: Students will spend the week learning about our local cultures, history, and environment while attending class at the Oulu Cultural and Heritage Center. Students will experience learning in a one-room schoolhouse, prepare traditional ethnic recipes, play games, and make a variety of arts and crafts. Students in grades 5 and up will have opportunities to go on local adventures which may include: canoeing, biking, hiking, and kayaking. **(Capped at 30)**

Oulu Heritage Week 2: (Grades 1-12) Exploring Cultures, History, and Environment: Students will spend the week learning about different cultures, historical time periods, and environments while attending class at the Oulu Cultural and Heritage Center. Students will experience learning in a one-room schoolhouse, prepare ethnic recipes, play games, and make a variety of arts and crafts. Students in grades 5 and up will have opportunities to go on local adventures which may include: canoeing, biking, hiking, and kayaking. **(Capped at 30)**

Plein Air Painting (Grades 6-12)

Outdoor painting in the tradition of the past, with easels and paints in the great outdoors is the adventure that awaits students who sign up for this sectional! Students will be allowed to enter their paintings in the Plein Air art festival in Port Wing that is becoming an annual sensation. After a short lesson and warm up exercises, students will divide into small groups and paint with an artist outdoors. Students will learn observation skills and basic sketching and painting techniques. **(Capped at 15)**

Swimming Lessons (Grades 1-8) We have great fun in store for you in the pool this year! We will have lessons at the Bayfield Recreation Center with a licensed swim instructor, lifeguard, teacher, and helpers. **(Capped at 30)**

Volleyball Skills Development (Grades 5-8 8:30-1:00 PM) or Grades 9-12 6:00-9:00 PM)

Students will learn basic pass, set, serve and spike/block. Moving into setting up a play and targeting your serve. Games will be played to put the skills learned to the test.

Football Skills Development (Grades 9-12 6:00-9:00 PM)

Students in Grade 9-12 will have an opportunity to work on Football based skills such as passing, running, catching, and kicking. The general rules of the game and blocking techniques will be explained throughout this class. Receiver route running, hand-offs, snaps, along with other general football information will be covered in preparation for the Fall High School Football season set to begin on August 8th. (Available only to students residing in the South Shore School District)
